

The FIU CONNECT (Human Trafficking) training program from ManchesterCF advises participants on suspicious financial patterns that may indicate human trafficking behaviour through detailed case studies, examples and red flags.

Human trafficking produces enormous sums of illicit profits for criminal groups. If banks are able to transmit accurate and timely financial intelligence to the authorities, the exploitation of minors and other victims of human trafficking can be greatly reduced.

By analysing financial intelligence, financial services staff can spot transaction patterns related to possible human trafficking and domestic sex slavery.

With proper training, bank staff can employ financial metrics and data to link victims, their captors and financial institutions. These links can form key components of a law enforcement investigation and the recovery of exploited victims. Graduates of this course can apply to receive a verified digital badge issued by Credly which can be shared on social media platforms.

This program was designed from a North American perspective. By recognising potential patterns of human trafficking, financial institutions can provide law enforcement with the information needed to prosecute offenders and protect themselves from money laundering activity.

Regulators are demanding increased attention to detail within a financial institution's AML training. ManchesterCF's solutions meet then exceed those expectations.
